To discuss where you would like to give birth, please talk to your GP.



If your first choice maternity unit is fully booked, we will contact you to help you book at another unit.





At hospital most women who give birth will be looked after by midwives.

Some women may need extra care and they will be cared for by doctors.



You can also choose to give birth at home. A midwife would come to your home to help with the birth.

The care you get before giving birth is called 'Antenatal Care.'

Health centres


What our hospitals are like
